



DIVISION FFA

Exhibit animals cannot be the same for 4-H, FFA and Open Class. Must be separate animal.

1. Any person who is a paid-up member of the Minnewaska FFA Chapter or a Chapter which part of whose territory lies in Pope or a neighboring county is eligible to compete in the Pope County Fair.

2. All projects or livestock must be the possession of the FFA member and be entered by him or her. Entries to the FFA Barnyard by non FFA members may be made only by permission from the Minnewaska FFA Advisor.

3. Livestock show people will be furnished pens and first day's bedding for their exhibits. All pens and the space surrounding them must be kept neat and orderly at all times. Provide your own grain, additional bedding, pails and feedboxes.

4. All livestock exhibits will be subject to the same health rules as are applicable for 4-H and open class exhibitors.

5. All stalls and pens must be cleaned by 9:30 a.m. each day.

6. Judging will follow the same livestock or poultry exhibited upon completion of the 4-H judging. Livestock exhibitors should be available incase the number of exhibits warrants showing them in the ring as opposed to in pens.

7. All exhibits must be in place by 3:00 p.m. on opening day of the fair.

8. Exhibits must remain in place until 5:00 p.m. on the final day of the fair. Failure to comply with these rules constitutes forfeiture of premium.

9. Entries must be made with the Minnewaska FFA Advisor by July 26th, 2011.

10. The Pope County Agricultural Society Fair Board reserves the right to combine or split classes when deemed necessary.

11. Lots marked ** have no class at State Fair.

12. Information on judging procedure, preparations for and of livestock for exhibiting and showing procedure may be obtained from Minnewaska FFA Advisor Nancy Loen at 320-766-6296.

Suggested animals include cow with calf, young goats, pony or colt, donkey, ewe with lamb, turkeys, geese, etc. Entries will be left up to the discretion of the FFA Advisor.
