



EVENT POLICIES

General Information

- The Pope County Agricultural Society Fair Board reserves the final and absolute right to interpret or add to these rules and regulations as they in their judgement may deem advisable and arbitrarily settle all matters, questions and differences in regard thereto or otherwise arising out of or connected with, or incident to the fair.
- No dogs or other animals allowed except for service or approved exhibit. All animals present must have appropriate vaccinations and health certificates.
- 3. No golf carts, ATVs, et. Without express permission of the board.
- 4. No person shall be permitted to distribute advertising matter on the grounds except from their place of business or exhibit. The taking or posting of any advertisement, bill cards, etc. except within the space occupied by the exhibitor is strictly prohibited. Vendors are required to remain in their appointed space. Anyone violating this rule will be subject to a fine and expulsion from the grounds as the Board of Directors may elect. The Board of Directors reserves the right to prohibit any and all items found objectionable to it.
- 5. All accidents must be reported to the Fair Office immediately.
- Should the need arise, the Pope County Fair has designated protest area. The location will be posted in the fair office.
- 7. Videos and photos taken at this event may be used for promotionally and for social media.
- Camping and exhibiting are by approved registration with the appropriate fee only.

Entries

- No exhibitor shall be allowed to make more than one entry in any one lot and nothing (other than livestock) that has previously been entered in the fair shall compete for a prize. No article shall compete for more than one premium. Entries in individual lots shall not appear as part of collections. Entries accepted from Pope and adjoining counties only
- Items must be entered in the names of the true owner and must have been raised or made by the exhibitor since the last fair. The fair board and open class committee has the right to disqualify items they feel do not follow these regulations. Any person knowingly violating these rules will forfeit all right to any premiums or prizes awarded to them.
- Every article in competition must correspond with the number, size and description in the premium list and be in the proper class in order to obtain premiums. No change or alteration will be permitted after the books are placed in the hands of the judge.
- Each entry tag shall be securely fastened to the article by the exhibitor.
- All articles and premiums not called for within 30 days of the fair will be forfeited.

- 6. The management will do its best to arrange space for all exhibitors, but after present facilities are exhausted, the Board reserves the right to close entries at any time.
- The Board will take every precaution in its power for the preservation of the articles on exhibition, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur in the delivery, exhibition or removal of exhibits.
- All articles are to remain on exhibit until the scheduled release time. Premiums will not be paid on articles removed from exhibition.
- 9. The awards system for open class shall be designated by ribbons, stickers or the like as follows: Grand Champion (\$5.00); First—Blue (\$4.00); Second-Red (\$3.00). All awards shall be made by comparison of individual merits of the exhibits. Premiums will not be paid on inferior exhibits even though there may be no competition.
- Any attempt by the exhibitor to influence or dictate the decision of the judge shall be sufficient cause of excluding his or her entry from competition and must be reported to the committee.
- 11. No appeal from the final decision of the judge is allowed. An exhibitor may protest to the committee.
- 12. Entries will be accepted the Monday prior to the fair from 1 to 7 pm.
- All exhibits are released Sunday after the fair at 9 am. Other arrangements for later pick-up may be made as necessary.
 Exhibitors may be asked to show proof of name before collecting exhibits.
- If premium checks are not available at exhibit check-out, they will be mailed.
- 15. If youth exhibitors were assisted by an adult, a photo of the youth working on the project should be provided with the exhibit.
- 16. No item shall be put in the "any other" lot, if a lot exists for that item.
- 17. Only finished, mounted work will be accepted.

Livestock

- All livestock must follow current Minnesota Board of Animal Health Regulations and be inspected by the official fair veterinarian before entering the barn.
- 2. Exhibitors will care for their own animals and provide their own feed, water and bedding.
- The International Association of Fairs and Expositions (IAFE) Code of Show Ring Ethics will be followed.



ONLINE REGISTRATION

In an ongoing process to make exhibiting at the fair easier for everyone to participate, the Pope County Fair is utilizing online self registration. You can complete this registration in just a few easy steps.

- 1. You will need a valid email address to complete the registration process online.
- 2. If this is your fist time registering online, set aside 15-20 minutes to register.
- 3. Exhibitors who use the online registration process will reduce their registration and entry time at the fairgrounds on entry day by up to 75%.
- 4. Review the premium book and jot down or circle the division, class and lot of the items you wish to enter.
- 5. Navigate to www.popecountyfair.org and click on Schedule. There you will find the Open Class section. Click on the Online Registration button.
- 6. Read the directions on the screen; they will guide you through the process.
- 7. If you miss registering an exhibit, you are welcome to log back in at any time and add items.
- 8. When complete, make sure to review your entries and check out.
- 9. There is no cost for registration in Pope County; the checkout just confirms your entries.

- 1. Ribbon Premiums are paid by the Pope County Ag Society. These checks are issued after the fair by the Ag Society, and will be mailed with auction checks or can be picked up at the office. (The office will email when available for pickup; wait for an announcement).
- 2. Exhibit Release: Exhibitors need to meet exhibition requirements of the local County Fair Ag Society and the 4-H Youth Development Program from 4-H exhibit entry day through release time. If exhibition requirements are not met (and permission is not granted by 4-H Program Staff), youth will not be eligible for all show related premiums, awards, and participation in the state event. Approved early release is an exception to the rule and becomes a 4-H staff and Agricultural Society decision based on each situation.
 - Non-perishable static exhibits must be in place by 7 p.m. Friday, July 28 for judging and display. Perishable projects (Foods, flowers, vegetables) will be judged on Tuesday, August 1 and must be in place by 6 pm. Static exhibits are released on Saturday, August 5 at 9 pm when the building closes. Items that cannot be carried out should remain in place until Sunday morning. Building will be open for final exhibit pick up from 9-10 am.
 - Animal exhibits must be in place by 7 pm on Tuesday, August 1. Animals are released at 7 a.m. Sunday, August 6.
 - O After animals are released, animal exhibitors are responsible for:
 - All animal exhibitors are responsible for removing all bedding/manure from the pen/stall/cage and bringing it to the manure pit before leaving the fairgrounds.
 - ② Goat, Poultry, Rabbit, Sheep, Swine exhibitors need to take down cages and pens in the exhibitors assigned area up to the next animal present.
 - 2 Cattle exhibitors need to help take down the panels in the middle of the cattle barn and clean up and take down the tie out panels.

- 3 The Agricultural Society will take every precaution in its power for the preservation of the articles and stock on exhibit, but will not be responsible for any loss or damage that may occur during the delivery, exhibition or removal of exhibits.
- 4. Bedding, Equipment, & Barn Rules
 - All Animal Exhibits: The County Ag Society will furnish stalls, pens, & first bedding for all livestock exhibits. Dairy, Sheep & Goats will receive straw bedding. Beef will use wood chips. All other species will receive shavings. Additional bedding, feed, water, etc. is the exhibitors responsibility. Bedding must be low in dust, free of pests & molds, & easily removable.
 4-Her's exhibiting livestock at the fair are responsible for the care & feeding of animals as deemed by Vet. Exhibitors not providing proper animal care will be disqualified from exhibition.
 - Cattle: Cattle should be double tied with a halter & neck tie.
 - Horse, Goats, and Sheep: Blankets are acceptable at any time.
- 5. Barns are closed at 10:00 p.m. No one should be entering after that time without prior authorization from the Agricultural Society.
 - Ties outs: Cattle can be taken to tie-outs at 9pm Wednesday & Thursday and 10pm Friday & Saturday. Tie outs are optional and exhibitors using the tie outs are responsible for cleaning and taking down the tie outs at the end of the fair.
- 6. Guest access to barns must be maintained throughout the fair. Do not block alleyways, play loud music, or in any other way prohibit guest's enjoyment of viewing the exhibition. At all times be courteous and respectful.
- 7. Agricultural Society rules and policies for the Pope County Fair will be enforced by the Agricultural Society.





- Any person who is a paid up member of the Minnewaska FFA Chapter or a Chapter which part of whose territory lies in Pope or a neighboring county is eligible to compete in the Pope County Fair.
- 2) All projects or livestock must be the possession of the FFA member and be entered by him or her. Entries to the FFA Barnyard by non FFA members may be made only by permission from the Minnewaska FFA Advisor.



FARM CROPS, GARDEN VEGETABLES and FRUITS

Beets, carrots, parsnips, turnips and rutabagas: Mature but not overgrown, pithy or coarse in texture. Tops trimmed off 1 1/4 inches above the crown. Side roots trimmed off but not the taproot. Clean by brushing, not scrubbing.

Broccoli-Heads should be dark or purplish green and compact. Avoid yellow flowers in head. Stems cut about 5 inches from the top of the head.

Cabbage-Stems cut about 1/2 inch below the head. Remove blemished or broken leaves. Leave 2-3 wrapper leaves.

Cauliflower— Heads should be white, compact and free of small leaves and rich texture. Stems cut to 4 to 6 inches. Outer leaves trimmed to 1-2 inches above the white head. Use soft bristled brush to remove dirt from head.

Celery-Remove roots of stalk and trim butt to form a pyramid. Trim diseased and broken leaves on the outside until color is uniform.

Cucumbers-Pickling: select fruits 3-5 inches long. Slicers: select fruits that are straight, dark green and 6-10 inches long

Specimens should be the same stage of maturity and uniform in size, shape and color. Leave stems attached, use a soft brush to clean.

Eggplant-Uniform in color and free from bronzing or greening. Stem should be left on.

Kale, Spinach and Chard: Display in a jar with water.

Kohlrabi-Roots removed just below the ball. Remove all but the center 4-6 leaves. Select specimens that are medium size and not hard or woody. Skin should be easily punctured by thumbnail. They should be clean but not washed.

Lettuce-Dig, leaving roots and exhibit in a glass container with leaves above the water.

Melon-Select fruit that separates easily from the vine. Melons should be mature but not overripe.

Onions-Have specimens mature and thoroughly cured. The neck should be small. Do not peel to give a slick appearance. Only such outer scales that are broken or discolored should be removed. Small basal roots should be left intact but trimmed to a uniform

Length of 1/2 inch. Wipe or brush but do not wash. Cut tops to 1 to 1 1/2 inches long.

Peas-Select bright green well filled with seeds, the best eating stage. Do not wash as bloom should be preserved.

Peppers--stem should be left 1/2 to 1 inch long. Select uniform fruits.

Radishes-Tap root cut 1/2 inch and tops cut 1/2 inch.

Rhubarb-Select stalks that are straight, uniform, and unblemished. Stalks should be pulled from the plant, not cut. Cut off blade leaf 2 inches above the stalk.

Snap Beans-Harvest before constrictions appear between the seeds, when seeds are half grown. Pods should be wiped clean but not washed. Leave stems attached, trimmed to a uniform length.

Summer Squash-Select a small size fruit when the rind is soft and easily punctured with a fingernail.





POPE COUNTY FARM FAMILY OF THE YEAR

The Pooch family of Farwell was named the Pope County's 2022 Farm Family of the Year by the University of Minnesota.

In 1953, Delmar and Ida Pooch purchased the original Pooch farm in Nora Township. They raised dairy cows, hogs, sheep, chickens and crop farmed. Their son, Vernon, began farming in 1973 by milking cows: later he began farrowing pigs and selling seed corn. In 2000, Vernon's son Nick, started feeding Holstein steers and crop farming. In 2008, his brother Austin began farming with Nick and they expanded their crop acreage.

Currently, the family grows corn, seed soybeans, wheat, oats, alfalfa and grass hay on 1,500 acres. They feed several hundred head of northern Minnesota beef calves to finish annually. They also background beef calves. The pooch family practices minimum tillage on their crop ground: they plant corn and soybean research plots and sell Gold Country Seed.

Brothers Nick and Austin run the daily operation of the farm. Their father, Vernon, helps with field work and sells seed. Nick's wife, Kris, vaccinates the cattle and helps keep them healthy, drives tractor and handles the bookwork. Austin's wife, Katie, works in the healthcare industry. Nick and Austin's mother, Sonia, is retired. Nick and Kris have three children: Blake, Brady and



Blaine. Austin and Katie also have three kids: Avery, Sadie and Porter. The brothers' sister Venessa, lives in Montana.

All the kids in the Pooch family are in 4-H, where they show beef calves and sheep. The kids are the second generation of the family to show livestock. Austin is a Pope County Fair Board member; Nick is a member of the Glacial Ridge Cattlemen's Association and serves on the Pope County FSA Committee. Vernon is involved with Pope County Corn and Soybean Growers and the Minnesota Farmers Union, Austin and Katie's family attend Our Lady of Runestone Catholic Church in Kensington. Nick, Kris and their family along with Vernon and Sonia attend Lowry Covenant Church.

POPE COUNTY AG INSPIRATIONAL LEADERS

Pope County Farm Bureau was recognized for their outstanding agricultural leadership. Most noteworthy is the very successful Breakfast on the Farm initiated in 2019. These leaders also initiated and continue to support an Ag Career Day at Minnewaska High School, have begun an Ag Communications Intern Scholarship program and have done Ag in the Classroom and Ag in the Park events for elementary youth. They welcome new members, ideas and those seeking ag leadership development.


